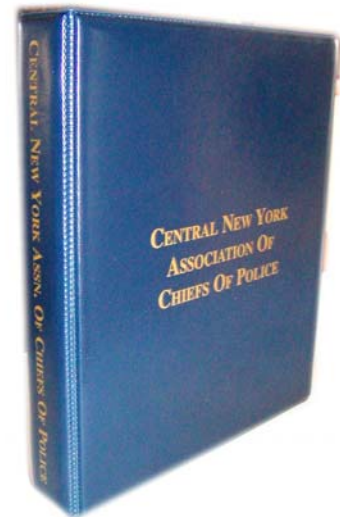

Nick Macherone, State Chief's Liaison to the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee reminds police executives that the next wave of Buckle Up New York (BUNY) enforcement is May 21 to June 3. Departments are encouraged to participate in the initiative regardless of whether they are funded. According

to Mr. Macherone, "Seatbelt compliance has slipped over the past year, both nationally and in New York. The National Highway Safety Administration (NHTSA) and Governor's Traffic Safety Administration (GTSC) are asking for your increased support during this upcoming wave."
